

SCHEDULE B – FEEDSTOCK ELIGIBILITY

Please note: The following guideline may be updated from time to time.

All applicants must complete Schedule B.

	SECTION ON FORM	TIPS FOR APPLICANTS
	Facility or Project Name	Provide the “Facility or Project Name” that is entered on the Application Form item #4 (Facility or Project).
	Date of Application	Provide the date entered at the top of the Application Form.
1.	Production Status	Check one box only.
2.	Description of Feedstocks	<p>Please comment under each question if you are unable to answer the question because the project is not sufficiently advanced.</p> <p>Attachments are optional if more space is needed to answer the questions.</p> <p>If you change to or add other feedstocks in the future which are not identified in this application, you must reconfirm bioenergy product eligibility with Alberta Energy.</p>
3.	Municipal Waste	If municipal waste is identified as a feedstock, an attachment is required to describe in detail the processes and methodology that will be used to ensure the material contains at least 50 per cent biomass by mass on an annual average basis, in accordance with the Municipal Waste Guideline (Alberta Environment.)
4.	Feedstock that is a Bioenergy Product	<p>The purpose of this question is to confirm that:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> if bioenergy is produced using another bioenergy product that potentially qualifies for support under the BPCP, the facility must produce both products; and the applicant is not applying for credits on bioenergy products produced in succession from the same unit of biomass.
4a.		<p>Only complete Question 4a if “Yes” was the answer provided in Question 4.</p> <p>For example, if a facility produces wood pellets and generates electricity from those wood pellets, the generated electricity may qualify for credits.</p> <p>In this example, if the wood pellets used to generate electricity were acquired from outside the facility, then the producer of electricity is considered a bioenergy consumer and does not qualify for support under the BPCP.</p>

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4b.	<p>Only complete Question 4b if “Yes” was the answer provided in Question 4. The purpose of this question is to ensure that the applicant is not applying for credits on successive bioenergy products.</p> <p>For example, if a facility produces wood pellets and generates electricity from a portion of those wood pellets, they can apply for credits on either the electricity or the portion of wood pellets used in generating electricity, not both.</p> <p>The producer may also apply for credits on any portion of wood pellets not used to generate electricity at the facility.</p>
